This year again we have delivered on Surf Life Saving Queensland's primary objective of Zero Preventable Deaths in Queensland public waterways. Thank you to everybody who has patrolled with the Hervey Bay Surf Life Saving Club this season. Your combined efforts and dedication have been outstanding and has been appreciated by our community.

As a club again we hosted a number of successful events such as the Hervey Bay Masters Carnival, the Torquay Hotel Pier 2 Pub Ocean Swim and Junior Branch. As per usual our events have received amazing feedback from those who have supported us and I offer my thanks to everybody who volunteered their time to make our events a success.

I would like to take this opportunity to sincerely thank our committee for their combined commitments this season and I will thank in advance anybody who is putting their hand up to get involved in the new season. Our focus going forward will be to ensure the sustainable future of the Hervey Bay Surf Life Saving Club and I again invite you all to get involved in some little way, as we all know many hands make light work. If too few do too much our future will not be so secure, so please get involved.

There was so much that I was trying to achieve and this year was a classic example of the best laid plans not going to plan with the arrival of COVID 19. I am committed to leading the Hervey Bay Surf Life Saving Club into a bright and sustainable future.

Another successful and rewarding year has rolled by albeit cut short by COVID-19!

We have been fortunate to secure a substantial amount of grant monies this year, and my thanks go to the SLSQ grant writing unit. This year we have been fortunate in obtaining over \$60,000.00 in grant monies being acquitted against: \$15,000.00 for the purchase of a new IRB Hull, from the Casino Gambling fund, this will be one of the new breed of boats, they have just been approved for use by SLSA; and through a Federal Grant via Keith Pitt MP we have also received funding for another IRB hull and new SSV (ATV). We should have them by start of next season. The Keith Pitt grant was a 50:50 grant, so we will sell the current SUV and two of the old IRB hulls to assist in our 50% commitment to this grant. \$5,100.00 from the Brisbane Airport Corporation has provided for us a new IRB motor; \$8,000.00 Sport and Recreation has provided funds for the new nipper boards the kids have been using this season; \$5,000.00 from the Australian Institute of Sports to subsidise the Nipper uniforms (caps and pint vests) for this season and another \$900.00 for Pier to Pub and a \$5,000.00 grant from the Fraser Coast Regional Council. We also received \$5,000.00 from the Bendigo Bank for upkeep of the 4WD.

Without the financial support and the hours of volunteer support from our sponsors we could not function as successfully as we do. They believe in what we do as a club and their support is invaluable. Our sincere thanks to Bayside Radiology, Bendigo Community Bank Hervey Bay, Hervey Bay RSL and Sub Branch, Torquay Hotel, Golden Shores, The Boat Club, Bean Beat, Bob Wicks from Bob's Tyres, Select Shopfitters, Craig Thompson from Thommo's Plumbing, PBS Building, Latitude 25 Hervey Bay, Watkins Electrical, Urangan Bowls Club, Morgan Sewing Centre, Clayton Hearing, Fraser Coast Massage, Andrew Harwood Chiropractic, Rebel Sports who provide us with gift vouchers from their Community Kickback Programme (so don't forget to say you are a Hervey Bay SLSC member when you purchase goods from Rebel!), T & S Auto's for servicing our 4WD free of charge and all our other supporters of our wonderful club, we thank you for being there for us. Especially with the ongoing COVID-19 situation, it is now more than ever time to support our sponsors and buy locally when you can, making sure you tell them you are with the Hervey Bay Surf Life Saving Club!

The Management Committee and members would like to acknowledge the Federal Government, Department of Community Services, Sport and Recreation, SLSA, SLSQ, SLSQ Wide Bay Capricorn and the Fraser Coast Regional Council for their continued support and financial input. We would also like to acknowledge the Hervey Bay SLSC Supporters Club for their ongoing financial assistance of the Hervey Bay Surf Life Saving Club. The Supporters Club had a fantastic year and has donated over \$20,000.00 to the Surf Club this season. My thanks to the Supporters Club Committee and volunteers who have manned the bar this season, this being where a high volume of the Supporters Club income is generated, from which enables them to donate to the Hervey Bay Surf Life Saving Club.

The Nippers fundraising efforts have been successful with "Shake a Tin" at Stocklands and our Sunday sausage sizzles being the main income stream for them.

#### TREASURER REPORT

On a personal note, I would like to thank my fellow committee members for their support, encouragement, friendship and team spirit through what has been an extremely busy year for us all.

Thanks to my darling wife, Anita for preparing the accounts and keeping the never-ending stream of surf club paperwork I take home in order.

# Club Captain Report 2019-2020



Our 2019 -2020 season has come to an end, marking one of our most trying seasons due to the health pandemic of COVID-19. Our season started well with many new members joining our patrol teams thanks to our dedicated trainers and enthusiastic admin team members, encouraging our Junior Life Saving parents to join our cause and help out our community by way of patrolling our beaches and helping out at Junior Life Saving for water safety. This season, due to very limited training time available we only had 12 people complete their Bronze Medallion award and 11 members complete their Surf Rescue Certificate. We maintained our 9 patrols and again we dropped the surveillance patrol from Saturday mornings. During the later stages of this season's patrols, our beaches were very quiet due the restriction of public access to our beaches and in conjunction with SLSQ guidelines our patrols dropped back to surveillance status leaving us with minimal members patrolling until the close of season.

#### 2020-2021 Patrol Agreement

As per last year the HBSLSC committee reviewed the past patrol season and again projected the members available for patrolling for the next season and it has been decided to continue with our 2 Bronze and 1 SRC minimum strength, as per previous years. Due to the possibility of further restrictions in the upcoming season, we will be requesting formal recognition of the option for surveillance patrols allowing minimal presence to alleviate unnecessary public interaction if COVID-19 issues persist. This ideal will be evaluated during the upcoming season and be guided by SLSQ.

#### Special Event Water Safety

With restricted water base sporting events our water safety teams received a well-earned rest this season. Hopefully in the upcoming season and the lifting of sporting restrictions, our water safety teams can get our feet wet again, enjoy our ocean and help out with our local events and triathlon clubs again. I would still like to recognize our special members for this season who braved the elements in the early hours and made sure our commitments were met.



#### WAVERUNNER 30 (Support Operations)

Wave Runner 30 Support Operations surveillance service is still going strong with 6 operators still patrolling our waters. Our female support service operator performed a different type of rescue this season. Ashleigh was on her normal operations route, when she was tasked with the unusual duty of saving one of our favourite Aussie icons, a very misguided Kangaroo located approximately 1.5km off shore. Ashleigh with the help of an off-duty life saver and some creative rescue techniques, retrieved the animal from the ocean and returned it back to dry land to an awaiting team from RSPCA.





This season our operations team received an updated 2017 rescue craft, making our members surveillance duties much more comfortable because of the new hull design. During the COVID- 19 changes our members were required to be more vigilant in maintaining our operating equipment cleaning and sanitising and were asked to increase our presence on the water due to less beach patrols on our local beaches.

I'd like to thank our team for volunteering their personal time over and above their beach patrols and increasing our patrolling strengths and enabling the movement to spread the work load further.

#### Member Beach Patrol Hours

Through-out the season we always seem to have a few dedicated members that turn up for their patrol day in day out and also volunteer for extra patrols to help out other teams during the season. These members dedicate their personal time away from their families and homes, to make sure our beach goers are kept safe and keep our movement alive on our beach. In surf lifesaving across Queensland there is a 75-80% drop out rate between under 13's to under 18's. Our club is no exception; in fact, our drop-out rate has been at the top end of the scale for this age group. High drop outs occur across all sports and are possibly worse in regional areas. The challenge is to keep this group motivated and involved. In surf lifesaving there are plenty of different aspects of involvement. There is competition, community involvement, personal development and socialisation (remember that).

The mission for our youth group (cadets) was to keep them involved in the club. Give them somewhere that they can have fun and enjoy what they do in a safe environment.

The cadets this year were enthusiastic about being involved in the club, most continuing to help out on patrols and BBQs, when needed. Some continued with competition.

To keep the group together we organised specific cadet activities. Friday afternoon board paddles, and beach volleyball. We had pizza nights with guest speakers where they learnt about banking and budgeting from Wade Lineburg from BOQ. They learnt about the history of our club and what it was like to train and live as an elite athlete from Life Member, Darren Hauser.

The highlight of our season was our overnight trip to Rainbow Beach, where we helped with patrol. Perhaps the pizza and ice cream on the Saturday night were more of a highlight. It was a good learning experience in different conditions. The cadets did themselves proud and represented the club superbly over the weekend. Thanks to Lisa Paxton for helping out as a chaperone on the trip.

Although our season has been cut short, the cadets have continued their involvement with the club. Hopefully as a group we will grow, with more adventures ahead of us.

Congratulations to all our members for a fantastic Junior Surf Life Saving (JSLS) season. It is pleasing to see our membership numbers increase and remain healthy, despite some challenges that we faced early into the season which led to a restructure of a few positions within the Junior Activities Committee.

With a reshuffling of roles and further commitment from several Age Managers we were soon working as one team with one dream, to continue the development of beach and surf skills program with our juniors from Green Cappers to U15. This year we had 181 registered nippers up against 147 nippers last year, which was the biggest increase in 5yrs. We also had nine (9) registered U15's. The Junior Activities Committee (JAC) have put a significant amount of effort into ensuring we held Nippers every week-end, even when there were carnivals which at times stretched our resources. We all managed to rally together to ensure that the children who don't compete have the best chance of achieving their own goals and valuable lifesaving skills. For many of our nippers who continue to enjoy the challenges of competing, as it is a huge effort not only from the children but the club as a whole, a big thank you to parents, carers and club members that played a part in enabling the children to travel to carnivals and show

their talent. There is something very special about wearing the red and white cap and this can be seen by way of medals won by the children which are tabled within the Annual Report. Congratulations to all, as there are many great results across all age groups.

All our 181 nippers and nine (9) U15's should be congratulated for their enthusiasm, energy and commitment to Junior Surf Life Saving. As the carnival season began to warm up early December it was fabulous to see nippers develop skills and confidence in and out of the water, as well as new friendships. This would not be the case if it wasn't for our dedicated members filling valuable roles. We had 11 new Surf Rescue Certificate (SRC) members join our team this season so now we have 25 SRC personnel in total. Later in the season we had up to 12 Water Safety personnel at Nippers on Sundays which was an amazing turn out and is so critical to the success of Junior Surf Life Saving.



Our Water Safety Personnel, Age Managers and Officials continue to travel to all the carnivals and provide valuable assistance so that our nippers can compete. We have had a few nipper parents complete their officials' course and bronze medallion course this season, which improves our ability to hold water activities and importantly adds to the club's patrolling member numbers. Our trainers also provide opportunities for additional beach and water training, which were well attended by the nippers and improvements were noticeable as the season progressed.
