TREASURER REPORT

With the uncertainty of what our season would look like due to COVID, we made some financial decisions to protect our financial wellbeing and have come out the other end relatively unscathed.

We have been fortunate to secure a substantial amount of grant monies this year considering the country shutting down due to COVID. We got some new big-ticket items last financial year, which was lucky considering the decline in grants during COVID. My thanks go to the SLSQ Grant Writing Unit for their assistance in wording our grant applications to maximise our chances of gaining funding. This year we have been fortunate in obtaining over \$50,000.00 in grant monies being acquitted against: \$20,000.00 for the replacement of the rusting roof over the deck, thanks to Wayne Ahrens from PBS Property and Brendan Jackson from Stratco for assisting us with this essential project with project oversight and assistance with reduced costs for materials; \$5,000.00 grant from the Fraser Coast Regional Council towards the Pier to Pub; \$30,000.00 from SLSQ, QFES and SLSA for VMR grants and More Beaches Under Guard to replace our Patrol equipment.

Upcoming grant applications at present include \$12,000.00 to purchase new senior skis and boards and a \$5,000.00 grant to upgrade our computers/software etc.

We are also looking for a grant to refurbish our showers and toilets.

Without the financial support from our sponsors and the countless hours of assistance from our volunteers, we could not function as successfully as we do. They believe in what we do as a club and their support is invaluable. The club decided to suspend sponsorship requests and payments from our sponsors from March last year, as we felt that these businesses may suffer due to COVID. I am pleased to report that we have now restarted invoicing for sponsorship and all have reaffirmed their support for our lucky club for the foreseeable future. Our sincere thanks to Bayside Radiology, Bendigo Community Bank Hervey Bay, Hervey Bay RSL and Sub Branch, Torquay Hotel, Golden Shores, The Boat Club, Bean Beat, Bob Wicks from Bob's Tyres, Stratco, Craig Thomson from Thommo's Plumbing, PBS Building, Latitude 25, Watkins Electrical, Urangan Bowls Club, Morgan Sewing Centre, Clayton Hearing, Fraser Coast Massage, Andrew Harwood Chiropractic, Rebel Sports who provide us with gift vouchers from their Community Kickback Scheme where we raised over \$1000.00 raffling off a shopping spree at REBEL, another raffle coming so watch the newsletter for info, and don't forget to say you are a Hervey Bay Surf Life Saving Club member when you purchase goods from Rebel!; Trev from T & S Auto's for servicing our 4WD free of charge, Jason from Parnell Mobile Mechanics for servicing the ATV and all our other supporters of our wonderful club, we thank you for being there for us. We would also like to acknowledge P and B Nannes, one of our nipper grandparents, for their kind donations during the season and to Urangan Pier Markets for their donations. Coming out the other side of the COVID-19 situation, it is now more than ever time to support our sponsors and buy locally when you can, making sure you tell them you are with the Hervey Bay Surf Life Saving Club!

The Management Committee and members would like to acknowledge the Federal Government, Queensland State Government, Department of Community Services, Sport and Recreation, SLSA, SLSQ, SLSQ Wide Bay Capricorn and the Fraser Coast Regional Council for their continued support and financial input. We would also like to acknowledge the Hervey Bay Surf Life Saving Supporters Club for their ongoing financial assistance of the Hervey Bay Surf Life Saving Club. The Supporters Club had a reasonable year considering they were closed for half of it and has donated over \$10,000.00 to the Surf Club this season. My thanks to the Supporters Club Committee and Volunteers who have manned the bar this season, this being where a high volume of the Supporters Club income is generated, from which this enables them to donate to the Hervey Bay Surf Life Saving Club.

TREASURER REPORT

The Nippers fundraising efforts have been successful with our Sunday sausage sizzles being the main income stream for them. Thanks to Wayne from PBS for his donation of snags and bread each week. No "Shake a Tin" this year due to COVID.

Club Captain Report 2020-2021

Our 2020 -2021 season has come to an end, marking one of our most trying seasons due to the health pandemic of COVID-19. Our season started well with many new members joining our patrol teams thanks to our dedicated trainers and enthusiastic administration team members, encouraging our Junior Life Saving parents to join our cause and help our community by way of patrolling our beaches and helping out at Junior Life Saving for water safety. Even though we had many hurdles to overcome this season, due to limits forced upon our trainers we still put through 18 Bronze Medallion, 13 Surf Rescue Certificates and 6 IRB crew awards. This season we maintained our 9 patrols and again we dropped the surveillance patrol from Saturday mornings. This year's stats are as follows:

2021 - 2022 Patrol Agreement

As per last year the Hervey Bay Surf Life Saving Club committee reviewed the past patrol season and again projected the members available for patrolling for the next season and it has been decided to continue with our 2 Bronze and 1 SRC (Surf Rescue Certificate), minimum strength as per previous years. Due to the possibility of further restrictions in the upcoming season, we will be requesting formal recognition of the option for surveillance patrols, allowing minimal presence to alleviate unnecessary public interaction if COVID-19 issues persist. This ideal will be evaluated during the upcoming season and be guided by SLSQ.

Special Event Water Safety

With restricted water base sporting events our water safety teams received a well-earned rest this season. Hopefully in the upcoming season and the lifting of sporting restrictions, our water safety teams can get our feet wet again, enjoy our ocean and help out with our local events and triathlon clubs again. I would still like to recognize our special members for this season who braved the elements in the early hours and made sure our commitments were met.

WAVERUNNER 30 (Support Operations)

Wave Runner 30 Support Operations surveillance service is still going strong with five (5) operators still patrolling our waters. Our operations team was recognised for our excellent service and ability to maintain our equipment by SLSA Supports Operations providing our team with a brand-new Yamaha rescue craft, which has made our operations duties very comfortable with the new hull design. During the COVID-19 changes our members were required to be more vigilant in maintaining our operating equipment, cleaning and sanitising and were asked to increase our presence on the water due to less beach patrols on our local beaches. I'd like to thank our team for volunteering your personal time over and above your beach patrols and increasing our patrolling strengths and enabling the movement to spread the work load further.

JUNIOR ACTIVITIES REPORT



Congratulations to all our members for a fantastic Junior Surf Lifesaving (JSL) season. It was a challenging year at the start due to COVID-19 pandemic. We had an abrupt end of our 2019/20 season in March 20 and by August 2020 there were also challenges with starting and producing a JSL plan that would firstly protect our members, as well as protect the public whilst we accessed the beach for two (2) hours. Setting up our beach program took some thought in early days of 2020/21 season. Meeting compliance was a little bit of a moving target as SLSQ were also trying to obtain clear guidelines from State and Federal Government, by late September 2020 we had clearer guidelines and developed our plan. One of the challenges we faced was complying with social distancing and maintaining the 4m² rule, so the plan was needed for the area of beach required for about 100 to 150 children plus Water Safety personnel and Age Managers, etc. as it was thought our numbers from previous year may be little down.

This year we had 116 registered Nippers up against 190 the previous year. The Junior Activities Committee (JAC) and Club Management have put a significant amount of effort into encouraging Parents to assist this season, as managing 116 children under COVID-19 guidelines has added several new roles, thus the importance to increase the numbers of our volunteers. Thanks to our Parents, Carers and

Volunteers we managed to increase our numbers. It takes about 25 volunteers every Sunday to pull our program together to ensure the children's experience is fulfilling. This happens week to week for 20 plus weeks, even when there are carnivals which many of our competitive children and families love to attend. This does increase the work load but it is equally important to keep our program running for the balance of children that love the JSL program and just come to the beach on Sundays and have some fun and add to the Surf Lifesaving movement. We know this will in turn add strength to our Patrolling members in time, encouraging our children to achieve their own goals and valuable Life Saving skills is our number one priority. For many of our JSL who continue to enjoy the challenges of competing it takes a huge effort not only from the Children but the Club as a whole, a big thank you to Age Managers, Water Safety, Carers and Club Members that played a part enabling the children to travel to carnivals and show their talent. Congratulations to all, as there are many great results across all age groups.

All our 116 nippers should be congratulated for their enthusiasm, energy, and commitment to Junior Surf Lifesaving. As the carnival season began to warm up early December it was fabulous to see Nippers develop skills and confidence in and out of the water, as well as new friendships. This would not be the case if it were not for our dedicated members filling valuable roles. We had 13 new Surf Rescue Certificates (SRC) and 18 Bronze Member (BM) Awards issued this season. A massive thank you to Roo (Andrew Eason), he like many others has given endless hours to SLS movement, not just this year but for many years. Thanks to that we had up to 10 Water Safety personnel at Nippers on some Sundays, which is an amazing turn out and is so critical to the success of JSL.

Brief Background and Proposal – AGM 2021-22 Season

LIFE MEMBER #13

Andrew Eason started his Surf Lifesaving journey as a five-year-old Nipper at Long Reef Surf Life Saving Club, loved it right from the first day and stayed involved without any breaks until he ventured to the United Kingdom when he was 20 years old.

Some of Andrew's Awards whilst at Collaroy Surf Life Saving Club included;

- September 1982 - Bronze Medallion
- November 1983 Advanced Resuscitation Certificate
- February 1984 - Instructor's Certificate
- June 1984 - IRB Driver's Certificate
- July 1984 - Radio Operator's Certificate
- October 1984 - JRB Crewman's Certificate

Andrew never competed, it was more about the rescues and being part of the club that he was interested in.

He wanted to become involved in the Jet Boats, so had to join Freshwater Surf Life Saving Club as well.

At 18 years of age, he volunteered as a Crewie at weekends on the rescue chopper out of Royal North Shore Hospital. He has always talked about his days on this and we know that he found his love of helicopters again when he became a paramedic in the United Kingdom and was on the Essex Air Ambulance as a flight paramedic.



Andrew moved to the United Kingdom when he was 20 years old but always stayed in tune with what was happening in the Surf Lifesaving world.

Back to Australia, Andrew joined the Hervey Bay Surf Life Saving Club on 8th July 2010. (I am to believe it was one of the first things he did when arriving home.)

In his first year at the club Andrew (Roo) took on the role of the Hervey Bay Surf Life Saving Supporter's Club Treasurer when Leanne Walsh passed away. He has been in that position every year since, except 2015 when A. Aulsebrook held it for six (6) months, then stepped down and then Roo stepped up and took on the role again.



In 2011 he took on the role of treasurer of the Hervey Bay Surf Life Saving Club. He has held this position every year since, making it ten (10) years in a row. Roo has ensured the club has moved forward financially and certainly takes ownership of the role. His commitment over the last ten (10) years has ensured that we have built up a solid balance sheet and capital. The last 12 months with the pandemic the club management was able to focus on the operation aspects, what that meant for the Hervey Bay Surf Life Saving Club, we did not have to worry about paying our bills and our financial survival as it was well in hand.

NEW LIFE MEMBER

Over the last four (4) to five (5) years Andrew (Roo) has always placed a focus on raising up capital for the club to ensure we can stay functional and our members have new training equipment. He has been chasing every grant opportunity available which takes a huge amount of work; completing applications, obtaining quotes, etc. with sometimes tight time frames. As an example, the New Deck Roof we sit under only came about because of Roo. If he did not drive the grant application, we would not have had the cash to complete. He has also for the last seven (7) years been the driving force in organizing the “shake for cash can” fundraiser. I can say that Roo is the first there and last to leave on many occasions.



Andrew (Roo) gained his Jet-Ski Award in 2013 and still does rostered hours on the jet-ski. He has completed 103 patrol hours.

Andrew (Roo) became Club Trainer and Assessor in 2016 and has been training and assessing members ever since. We are not a club without this position being filled and Roo has done a great job as it is thankless task at times and one that has its challenges to say the least.

This year, 2020/2021 season, Andrew (Roo) also took on the role of Club CTO (Chief Training Officer) whilst he managed his other roles as Surf Life Saving Club and Supporter's Club Treasurer.

Andrew (Roo) has managed the Supporters Club Bar for several years and would have completed well over 200 hours behind or managing aspects of the bar. He continues to coordinate the stocking of the bar week to week and has run the canteen and organized raffles at all our club carnivals for many years.

It is just taken for granted at times that Roo will be there to manage the canteen, but that is what makes our club tick, the ones that just keep giving.



He has also taken on the role of First Aid Officer at several carnivals held at our club, whilst serving food at the canteen ... only joking!

Andrew's profession as a Paramedic has added another level to the club's training program, the children and members are very lucky to have an expert available as needed. He goes out of his way night and day to ensure we as a club have patrolling members year in, year out, as that is why we are here first and utmost. He is a great teacher and role model.

Last is his family, who should be first Anita and the boys who have shared just a little bit of Roo's time with us, we thank you.

On behalf of all current Life Members, I respectfully propose that Andrew Eason be inducted as our 13th Life Member.

SAFETY OFFICER REPORT

Well first year for me in this role, some big shoes to fill taking over from Ron Thomas who had spent five (5) years as Safety Officer at the club. I have been lucky to spend many years as a friend and work colleague with Ron, gives me comfort in ensuring that the club's best interests are always in play and ensuring that our members are educated and risk mitigation is put in place where needed.

Regular routine inspections with Electrical, Fire Extinguisher and Alarm testing are being monitored for compliance.

Some further processes have been put in place with training of each patrolling team in general maintenance of the SSV and we generally have seen improvement with care and operational aspects, ensuring longevity of this equipment.

Battery always on charge and working well.



Also, as we share the use of the Fraser Coast Council tower, we have had each Patrol group discuss and document the simple but very important task with accessing the tower safely; this will happen annually and be issued to Fraser Coast Council along with our Public Liability Insurance Certificate of Currency. Reminder; only Patrolling members can access this tower.

This year has been one of the most challenging for our club members and the interaction with using the public beach under COVID-19, again our members rallied to the cause and maintained compliance as directed by SLSQ.

There have been several challenging situations on the beach which has on two occasions seen patrolling members assist with rescues, which to say the least have been under very trying circumstances. Thank you to those members.

This off season we will see the installation of the new roof to the deck which is a major project and includes several club members who are volunteering their services. It is being managed to ensure that the risk to injury is well mitigated; basic training is being documented as Job Safety Statements and being signed by Volunteers and paid Workers.

Manual handling issues were managed in the IRB area with a hoist being installed to lift boats that are not being used; again, defined walkways were put in place and signage to alert members to stay clear of the hoist area. As the hoist is in a stationary position most of the time under load it is now double strapped to ensure that there is very minimal risk of the IRB coming down.

SAFETY OFFICER REPORT

For the last six (6) seasons, Helen Thomas our First Aid Officer has kept a pristine, well stocked first aid room for all patrol members to utilize; thanks Helen for your ongoing support.

Huge thanks to the same small band of workers that answer the call every year to come and look after the club. Ulf Malmros and David Boss, and now Kevin West has joined the team.

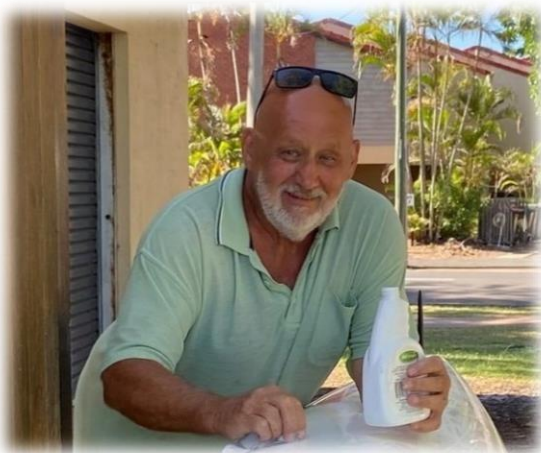
Safety is about continuous improvement - issues re-occur and the only way to keep on top of them is if everyone pitches in and helps:

The loss after depreciation for the financial year amounted to \$10,164 (2020 surplus:\$22,611). Club operations for competitions and sponsorship were reduced due to COVID-19. Resulting in a net decrease in cash and cash equivalents of \$16,883.

Notes to the Financial Statements

Hervey Bay Surf Life Saving Club Inc. For the year ended 30 April 2021

1. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

The financial statements are special purpose financial statements prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act Queensland. The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historic costs and do not take into account changing money values or, except where stated specifically, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless stated otherwise, have been adopted in the preparation of these financial statements.

Income Tax

The association is exempt from income tax pursuant to Section 50-40 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997 being a non-profit association.

Cash on Hand

Cash on hand includes cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, and other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.

Accounts Receivable and Other Debtors

Accounts receivable and other debtors include amounts due from members as well as amounts receivable from donors. Receivables expected to be collected within 12 months of the end of the reporting period are classified as current assets. All other receivables are classified as non-current assets.

Financial Assets

Investments in financial assets are initially recognised at cost, which includes transaction costs, and are subsequently measured at fair value, which is equivalent to their market bid price at the end of the reporting period. Movements in fair value are recognised through an equity reserve.

Inventory

Uniform inventory are measured at market selling value exclusive of GST.

Property, Plant and Equipment (PPE)

Leasehold improvements and office equipment are carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

The depreciable amount of all PPE is depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

Leasehold improvements are amortised over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

Accounts Payable and Other Payables

Accounts payable and other payables represent the liability outstanding at the end of the reporting period for goods and services received by the association during the reporting period that remain unpaid. The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amounts normally paid within 30 days of recognition of the liability.

Revenue and Other Income

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account any discounts and rebates allowed. For this purpose, deferred consideration is not discounted to present values when recognising revenue.

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest method, which for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument. Dividend revenue is recognised when the right to receive a dividend has been established.

Grant and donation income is recognised when the entity obtains control over the funds, which is generally at the time of receipt.

If conditions are attached to the grant that must be satisfied before the association is eligible to receive the contribution, recognition of the grant as revenue will be deferred until those conditions are satisfied.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax.

Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO). Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included with other receivables or payables in the assets and liabilities statement.

All capitalised property, plant and equipment is the property of Hervey Bay Surf Life Saving Club Inc. and are recorded in the accounts as donation expense in the year of expenditure.

Accounts payable and other payables represent the liability outstanding at the end of the reporting period for goods and services received by the association during the reporting period that remain unpaid. The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amounts normally paid within 30 days of recognition of the liability.

Revenue and Other Income

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable.

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest method, which for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument. Dividend revenue is recognised when the right to receive a dividend has been established.

Grant and donation income is recognised when the entity obtains control over the funds, which is generally at the time of receipt.

If conditions are attached to the grant that must be satisfied before the association is eligible to receive the contribution, recognition of the grant as revenue will be deferred until those conditions are satisfied.

Goods and Services Tax (GST)

The association is not currently registered or required to be registered for GST. GST registration is required where turnover exceeds \$150,000.

Income Tax

The association has self-assessed its taxable income for the year ended 30 April and as taxable income of the non-profit company is below the threshold of \$416 per year, it is not required to lodge a tax return for the current financial year. (2019:carried forward tax losses applied, nil taxable income.)

The income tax expense (income) for the year comprises current income tax expense (income).

Current income tax expense charged to profit or loss is the tax payable on taxable income. Current tax liabilities (assets) are measured at the amounts expected to be paid to (recovered from) the relevant taxation authority.

2. Taxable Income/(Loss)

The association has self assessed its taxable income (being a not-for-profit club) for year ended 30 April.

- it is a company that is not carried on for the purposes of profit or gain to its individual members;
- its constituent documents prohibits it from making any distribution, whether in money, property or otherwise, to its members.

The mutuality principle provides that where a number of persons contribute to a common fund created and controlled by them for a common purpose, any surplus arising from the use of that fund for the common purpose is not income.

The principle does not extend to include income that is derived from sources outside that group.


